FIRST AID SQUAD ADDS TO ITS TOOLS

The First Aid Squad recently purchased a number of high pressure air bags. These devices are used to provide efficient and non-threatening lifting of vehicles or heavy structures, such as a structure that has fallen on a victim.

During a training session with the new equipment, First Aid Squad members were able to lift Fair Haven's heavy pumper, Unit 1373, several inches off the ground with minimal effort.

The air bags will be added to other rescue equipment carried on the Fire Company's new Air/Rescue Truck, Unit 1385.

Adopt a Hydrant

During heavy snow conditions, the Fire Department faces a serious challenge in locating fire hydrants that are buried under plowed snow. During a fire situation, time lost in locating and shoveling out these hydrants can be disastrous.

While we do our best to visit each hydrant in Fair Haven and shovel it after a snowfall, this chore is tedious and time-consuming. Even if you don't have time to join our volunteer organization, you can provide a huge service by "adopting" the hydrant closest to your house and keeping it open for us! Talk it up with your neighbors and help us help you!

We also showed our support for families of New York City firefighters who were impacted by 9/11/01 (see p. 2 of the *Newsletter*).

My thanks to all of you who offered your support to me and my team during 2002. We are all volunteers, and that support is the "pay" we take home after each emergency call.

After a number of meetings with the FDNY firehouse at 48th Street and 8th Avenue, it was concluded that the best form of support would be to help with the Christmas party that had already been scheduled by the FDNY firefighters.

The Fair Haven team readily jumped in — and offered their support for setting up, serving, and taking down the party. Given Fair Haven's experience in running its annual Firemen's Fair, this was a "piece of cake."

After receiving appropriate clearances on the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey Turnpike, Fair Haven's new Rescue Truck 1385 made the journey to the headquarters of Engine 54 and Ladder 4.

FIRE DEPARTMENT AND FIRST AID ORGANIZATIONS SEEK NEW MEMBERS

Fair Haven Fire Company No. 1 is an all-volunteer organization, and we continue to seek members who can help in a number of capacities. Please consider volunteering your time to this worthwhile effort. Here is the information you need, if you are interested:

Fire Department—Active Firefighter. Members in this category respond to fires and emergencies in Fair Haven and surrounding communities in cases of "mutual aid." Although prior experience is helpful, none is required for admission to this category. Rigorous training is provided by both the Fire Department and by the Monmouth County Fire Academy. Applicants must pass a physical exam and a routine background check. Interested residents should contact James Butler, Sr. at (732) 741-3539 to discuss the membership application procedures.

Fire Department—Social Member. Members in this category participate in non-firematic aspects of operating the Fire Company, including fund raising events such as the annual Firemen's Fair. The only requirement for membership is a sincere interest in helping the Fire Company. Interested residents should contact James Butler, Sr. to discuss membership application procedures.

Fire Department—Honorary Member. Historically, this membership category was reserved for public dignitaries and others who have indirectly helped the Fire Company. Recently, however, the category has been expanded to admit potential First Aid Corps Members who are not interested in joining the Fire Department as an Active or Social member. Membership to this category requires a sponsor in the Fire Department. Residents interested in joining the First Aid Corps through this venue should contact William Acker at (732) 219-9754.

First Aid Corps Member. Members in this category respond to emergency trauma and medical situations and provide basic life support services. The First Aid Squad also responds to all fires and other emergencies in which injuries are likely. Members must be a member of the Fire Department (Active, Social or Honorary), before they can join the First Aid Corps. No prior experience is required, although new members must pass an approved First Responder or Emergency Medical Technician course during their first few months in the organization. Applicants must pass a physical exam and a routine background check unless they are Active Firefighters. Interested residents should contact William Acker to discuss membership application procedures.
