Message from First Aid Captain

It is a privilege to lead a squad that is dedicated not only to medical emergency calls, but year round support at all types of events, school functions, fire calls, mutual aid for out of town emergencies, training and classes every month, and of course, you'll see us all over the Fair Grounds during the last week of August during the 8 day Firemans Fair. Our primary mission, of course, is to help you during a medical emergency, and our all-volunteer first aid squad is made up of a few dozen members who respond 24/7 to over 400 calls in a typical year.

Want to join us? Whether you are fresh out of school or a retiree in town looking to give back, all that it takes is this: When that pager goes off, and the familiar sounds of the firehouse horns fill the air, you stop what you're doing, knowing a friend or neighbor or stranger needs help—And you go. Without skipping a beat. The first aid skills training comes second to the simple willingness to help others. Contact me to learn more: fhfascaptain@fhfd.org. In the meantime, here's a list of ways you can help us help you:

- 1. Is your house number visible from the street?
- Learn CPR! Know what to do if someone is choking. Know what to do if someone has a significant bleed..
- 3. DNRs (Do Not Resuscitate) A tough topic, but you must make sure these are available when needed.
- 4. Medications/Dosages: Have a list ready for us.
- 5. Your elderly relative: Please make sure you or your loved one's aides can tell us what their "typical" behavior is. Don't be afraid to tell us about dementia; we are trained in geriatric emergencies and understand if questions need to be asked in different ways.

Thank you for your support and donations, which helped us purchase new radios, AEDs, and ambulance upgrades. Enjoy the rest of your summer and maybe I'll see you at the Shuffleboard Booth! - *Katy Frissora*

YOUR KIDS KNOW EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FIRE PREVENTION!

Go ahead. Ask them.

Every October, FHFD Chiefs, ex Chiefs and Firefighters visit all the schools in Fair Haven and teach fire prevention to children in pre-school, kindergarten, and grades 1 to 5. Over 1200 children learn about fire safety, how to handle an emergency, calling 911, "Get out - Stay out", and many other topics about staying safe in school, at home, and at play. Your child in pre-K will crawl with a firefighter, in full turnout gear, along the floor in a simulated emergency. We teach them to look for the big yellow helmet and listen for the Darth Vader voice and not be afraid. Your kindergartner learns to check the door to his room with the back of his hand to prevent a burn injury before opening it. The second grader will understand the importance of a known family meeting place outside the home, under the big tree or at the end of the driveway, so we will know everybody is out safely. The fifth grader will know about "Edith" - Exit Drills In The Home. Fire drills are not just for school. Know a way out and practice it. The kids know that candles are dangerous. They know not to go back inside for the dog or cat, that's our job. They know not to hide in closets or under beds. They know to change the batteries in smoke detectors every 6 months. They know a lot about fire safety.

Go ahead. Ask them.


FHFD Wins Awards at the Colonia FD Parade!

On Saturday June 2nd, the Fair Haven Fire Company attended the 75th anniversary parade of the Colonia Fire Department. The Fair Haven Fire Company has a rich history and tradition of attending parades in support of other fire companies, a custom that goes back almost 100 years. A great example of this history is a framed photograph of the Fair Haven Fire Company lined up outside a firehouse in Coney Island on September 13th, 1923.



Planning and preparation for the Colonia parade began in February and fire company members worked three nights a week for months to get the fire engines ready to be judged in the parade. Countless hours were spent on cleaning, painting, and waxing of the participating apparatus. The hard work paid off and the Fair Haven Fire Company, marching in parade white uniforms, accompanied by the pipe and drum band St. Ann's of Hampton, won five awards for the parade including Best Appearing and Best Overall Fire Department!

2018 FHFD Volunteerism Scholarship Awarded to Kathryn Medrow



Athryn Medrow is the 2018 recipient of the FHFD Volunteerism Scholarship. The scholarship offers the winner a 4-year stipend of \$4000, based upon continued college enrollment and acceptable scholastic performance of the winner, who

must be either a Fair Haven resident or the child of the member of the Fire Company. Criteria include community involvement, volunteerism and scholastic accomplishments. Kathryn is a graduate of Biotechnology High School where she served in various capacities including senior yearbook editor, secretary of the Arts & Entertainment Club and an officer of the Technology Student Association. Outside of school, she was a member of the RFH Cross Country team, a singer with the Concordia Youth Chorale, and performed at TRTC in A Little Shakespeare: Merry Wives of Windsor.

Family and community have always been important to Kathryn. She has served at Park Church as a teacher in their Sunday School program and as a singer on the Worship Team. She has attended mission trips in the Dominican Republic, West Virginia and Pennsylvania. She received her Girl Scout Gold Award while working with Mrs. Koch at Knollwood school to provide a Science Club for 6th and 7th grade students .Kathryn has helped out at the FHFD Fair since she has been able to ride her bicycle to the station in the morning to help with fair prep. Three years ago, she "graduated" to helping in the Outback. She was also instrumental in supporting her mom's decision to join the First

Aid Squad and helped her study for her EMT certification. Kathryn is beginning her first semester at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, OH. She plans to study Biomedical Engineering and looks forward to



continuing in her spirit of volunteerism that was fostered here in Fair Haven.
