That fire was reported by one of our members in the wee hours of the morning, and our department contained the damage to one part of the structure. Church structures represent a very serious challenge to fire fighters, as I'm sure you've read. Our department demonstrated its outstanding training and skills that morning.

Our First Aid Squad has also been very active (see last page), and has upgraded the training of all of its active members to allow provision of external defibrillation to heart attack victims. This procedure has been proven to save many more lives than simply applying CPR without the use of the new equipment. We've already had a number of successful uses of this procedure in Fair Haven.

It goes on and on — Fire Police, Auxiliary, etc. All of our departments are adding value and service to this town.

But — what we need more than anything else right now is more volunteers. Please contact any of our officers to help in this extremely rewarding cause.

FROM THE FIRST AID SQUAD — Your volunteer emergency medical service (EMS) has answered over 200 calls for help, so far, in this new millennium. This is our usual volume for the first half of the year, compared to prior years. Though our calls are not decreasing, our membership has been declining over the years. Our dedicated volunteers are not getting any younger and because of the nature of the job, it has forced some into retirement. If you are not too familiar with the way we operate, here is a brief summary of how your local EMS system works and what role the Fair Haven volunteers play.

The Fair Haven First Aid Squad, a subsidiary of the Fair Haven Volunteer Fire Company No. 1, is staffed strictly by volunteers; people just like you and me. We all come from diverse backgrounds, different careers, ethnicity, gender, age, and length of residency in Fair Haven -- life-long residents and newcomers. We operate with two basic life support ambulances, a first responder vehicle and a rescue boat. Our members are certified in emergency care, either as a First Responder or an EMT. For any life-threatening emergencies, we are supported by MONOC Mobile Intensive Care Paramedics, a non-profit coalition of area hospital emergency departments. When someone dials 9-1-1, our volunteers stop what they are doing, whether that activity is dinner, house work, sporting activities, sleep or even being at their jobs. Because of our annual fundraiser and a borough budget, we do not charge a fee for our service.

If you have ever had any interest in becoming involved in the exciting field of emergency medicine, here is your opportunity. Most people respond, "I don't have the time." We do not expect every person to be available every minute of the day. We need help whenever it can be offered. For example, some of our members are commuters who can answer calls at nights or weekends. Other members are free during business hours, however, not available at nights. Also, for you students in town who are at least 18, you can be trained during the summer months or while you attend school. Some schools offer college credits and it will also look great on your resume!

Fair Haven has had a long tradition of volunteer EMS service. Without support from the community, such as yourself, we do not know how much longer the squad can exist. As taxpayers, we know that the borough certainly doesn't need to fund additional full-time employees to staff an ambulance. Please help us continue to help you!
